# RULES OF THE SOCIETY

1. The Society shall be called “**THE HAWKSHEAD AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY**”.
2. The Society is established for the purpose of improving stock by the distribution of Premiums, for such other competitions and exhibitions as the Committee may from time to time resolve, and generally for encouraging Agricultural improvements of every description.
3. The Society shall hold an Annual Show for the exhibition of stock and for other exhibitions and competitions, including home produce, handicrafts and horticulture, and shall award Premiums and other prizes in respect of such exhibitions and competitions. The Annual Show shall be held a fortnight prior to the first Tuesday in September, at Hawkshead.
4. The Society shall have a Committee, a President, President-Elect, Vice-Presidents, and ordinary Members. The Officers of the Society shall be a Chairman, a Vice-Chairman, a Treasurer and a Secretary, each of whom shall be a member of the Committee. The President and the President-Elect shall be ex-officio members of the Committee. There may also be elected to the Committee such number of other persons (being Members of the Society) as the Members of the Society may from time to time resolve. Members of the Committee shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting of the Society and shall hold office until the close of business at the next following Annual General Meeting, but shall be eligible for re-election for successive terms of office.
5. Save as otherwise provided in these Rules, the conduct of the affairs of the Society shall be in the hands of the Committee, who may meet together for the despatch of business, adjourn, and otherwise regulate their meetings, as they think fit. Questions arising at any meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes. In case of an equality of votes, the Chairman of the meeting shall have a second or casting vote. Unless and until otherwise resolved by the Committee, the quorum of the Committee shall be ten.
6. The Committee may delegate any of its powers to sub-committees consisting of such member or members of its body (and such other persons) as the Committee may from time to time resolve, provided that a majority of the members and the Chairman of every sub-committee shall be members of the Committee. Any sub-committee so formed shall in the exercise of the powers so delegated conform to any regulations that may be imposed on it by the Committee.
7. Subject to the provisions of Rules 24 and 30, any person who subscribes to the funds of the Society the sum of £5.00 (or such other sum as may from time to time be resolved by the Society in general meeting) shall become a Member of the Society and a Vice-President of the Society. A Vice-President shall have no duties or obligations beyond those of an ordinary member.
8. Subject to the provisions of Rules 24 and 30, every person who subscribes to the funds of the Society the sum of £5.00 (or such other minimum sum as may from time to time be resolved by the Society in general meeting) or more shall become a Member of the Society. Membership shall be on an annual basis, and the membership year shall run from 1st April to 31st March. No person shall be eligible to be elected as, or shall remain, a member of the Committee unless he or she is also a current Member of the Society; but this restriction shall not apply to the Treasurer or Secretary, who need not be Members of the Society.
9. Every Member of the Society who subscribes to the funds of the Society, the minimum sum referred to in Rule 8 shall be entitled to one ticket of admission to the Annual Show, and shall be entitled to a second ticket (but no more) upon subscription of twice such minimum sum (or any greater amount).
10. The Society shall hold an Annual General Meeting in November every year. The business of the meeting shall comprise the consideration of the Accounts of the Society and the reports of the Chairman and Treasurer, the election of officers and other members of the Committee, and any other business of which notice shall have been given to the Members. Not less than fourteen day's notice (excluding the date of the notice and the date of the meeting) shall be given to convene the Annual General Meeting and other general meetings of the Members.
11. No business shall be transacted at any general meeting unless a quorum of members is present at the time when the meeting proceeds to business. Ten members present in person shall be a quorum. At any general meeting a resolution put to the vote of the meeting shall be decided on a show of hands unless a poll is (before or on the declaration of the result of the show of hands) demanded by any two members present in person. On the occasion of a vote being taken on any resolution, every Member present in person shall, on a show of hands or on a poll, have one vote. No proxy voting is permitted. No alteration to the Rules of the Society may be made save by a resolution of the Members which has been duly proposed and seconded at the Annual General Meeting.

12. The Committee shall appoint one or more competent or disinterested persons to determine upon the merits of the different animals and other exhibits brought into competition, who are to give their judgement accordingly. To full panel of judges shall take part in the judging in Championship Classes.
13. The Committee may withhold any Premium or Prize in any case where it appears to the Committee that exhibits do not show sufficient merit; and may award Premiums and Prizes in every case where there appears great merit, although there may only be one competitor; any may make any alteration in the distribution of Premiums and Prizes as the Committee may at its discretion in any circumstances consider fit.
14. Any person entering a protest against a prize-winner shall lodge the sum of Five Pounds with the Secretary at the time of entering the protest, and this sum shall be forfeited to the Society in the event of the Committee deciding that such protest is frivolous. Every protest must be made in writing within seven days of the time of award, except a dispute as to the height of any horse exhibited, when the protest must be entered with the Secretary on the day of the Show. In the event of any dispute as to the height of any horse exhibited the same shall be measured with its shoes on. The decision of the Committee shall be final in all cases.
15. All stock entered for competition must be the bona fide property of and be on the holding of the exhibitor for a period of not less than 3 calendar months immediately prior to the date of exhibition. Any person infringing this Rule renders himself liable to prosecution for attempting to obtain money by false pretences.
16. Every exhibitor shall, on making his entry for any Premium in which the age of the animal is material, state its age in months, or in years and months calculated to the date of the Show, otherwise it will not be allowed to compete.
17. Every animal shall have a card bearing the number allotted to it by the Committee affixed to it before it is shown, otherwise it will not be allowed to compete. 18. In awarding each Premium, an animal shall be selected by the Judges as a reserve number to take the prize in case the same shall by any means become forfeited by the winning animal.
19. If an exhibitor, servant of an exhibitor, or other person having the charge of any animal or animals, shall refuse to obey the directions of the Committee or Secretary, (or any of them) such animal or animals shall immediately thereupon become liable to be disqualified from competing, or having been awarded a Premium or Prize shall be liable to forfeit it in favour of the animal next in order of merit.
20. The Society shall not be responsible for any loss under any circumstances of any Stock or Trade Stand or goods or wares exhibited or for any loss or accident which may occur to or through any Stock or Trade Stand or goods or wares exhibited or from any cause whatever, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor and competitor shall hold the Society free from liability in respect of any loss or accident; and indemnify it against any legal proceeding arising from any such loss or accident. All trade stands are required to complete and return a Society's Risk assessment form, this shall be condition of entry and they must provide a copy of their current Public Liability Insurance which may be asked to be shown on the day.
21. On the Annual Show day all exhibitors shall be allotted judging areas at the time appointed for judging them, and shall remain there until completion of judging and the award of Premiums or Prizes. Exhibits not fulfilling these requirements shall be disqualified, and any Premium or Prize won forfeited.
22. All entries must be in writing and submitted to the Secretary not later than such date as shall be decided each year by the Committee. Printed entry forms may be obtained from the Secretary. Acceptance of late entries will be at the discretion of the Committee and will, in any event, be accepted only upon payment of such further fee for each entry as the Committee may agree from year to year.
23. No animal having won first prize shall be allowed to compete again at the same Annual Show except for the Best Male or Female on the ground, or the Special Prize.
24. Should any candidate for a Premium or Prize be detected attempting to impose on the Society he shall forfeit such Premium or Prize and be expelled from the Society.
25. Every Bull over one year must be secured with a ring in the nose with a chain or staff attached, otherwise it cannot be admitted into the Show grounds, and all cattle must be tied to the place assigned or held securely. Foals will not be admitted unless led with a halter.
26. Every animal which has been awarded a prize ticket shall wear it until it leaves the field, otherwise the prize will be forfeited.
27. No stock to be taken off the field until after Grand Parade.

28. The Secretary and Steward shall have the discretionary powers to allow animals to leave the field under exceptional circumstances.
29. Premiums and Cash Prizes will be paid at the Annual Show day.
30. The Committee shall have the power at its discretion to terminate the membership of the Society of, or otherwise deal with, any Member, whose behaviour the Committee consider detrimental to the Society at any time; and in every such case (except by protest) any Premium or Prize money due to the person in question shall be retained by or forfeited to the Society. Re-admission to membership of the Society of any person whose membership has been terminated pursuant to the Rule or Rule 24 shall be entirely at the discretion of the Committee.
31. That the Society include a Horticultural and Home Crafts Section to be managed by a Committee of 24 members of the Society (seven of whom shall form a quorum) with powers to co-opt and a Secretary, to be elected at the Annual General Meeting.
32. That the Chairman, Secretary and two members of the Horticultural and Home Craft Section Committee shall serve on the General Committee.
33. That the Committee for the time being or the Executive Committee shall have power to rescind, alter and add to these Rules and regulations in such manner as they think beneficial to the interests of the Society and of Agriculture.
34. Fells & Shetlands Classes must be confined to registered ponies. Ponies must be named on the entry form and in the catalogue. Society rosettes will only be given to ponies registered with the Society or eligible for registration (i.e. foals).
35. Fells & Shetlands Three year old fillies with foals at foot may not be shown. All foals must be a minimum of 3 weeks old on the day of the show.
36. Stallions aged four years or over must hold either a Shetland Pony Stud-Book Society Licence or a Ministry of Agriculture Licence.
37. There must be no colts or entire males in Young handler classes. Children under 14 years old may not show colts (excluding foals) or entire males in In hand classes. Children under 11 years may not show entire males in ridden classes. Hard hats must be worn by all handlers aged 14 years or under in In hand classes. In the interest of safety hard hats must be worn by all exhibitors, irrespective of age in ridden classes. In ridden classes if a rider falls off at any time whilst in the ring, both pony and rider must leave the ring, rider dismounted and take no further part.
38. Judges, Exhibitors and Show Secretaries must be aware that a Judge may not place in a class a pony, which to their knowledge has been bred, sold, leased or produced by the Judge or their immediate family/employer; nor may they place a pony in which they have a financial interest; nor may they place a entire male by whom they have had a mare stunted in that season. Should a situation arise when such a pony appears a referee, preferably on the appropriate panel of Judges, should be appointed by the Show Secretary to place the pony in question in its class.
39. Note: Anyone exercising a horse or pony at any time must be correctly dressed and wearing a riding hat to the latest acceptable standards. If not they will be banned from competing.
40. While back protectors are not compulsory we do advise the wearing of these, particularly in Show Jumping classes.
41. Horses deemed unsafe will be asked to leave the arena.
42. For Health and Safety regulations we ask that all owners/handlers of horses or ponies adhere to all signs and directions given by the society.
43. All winners to be responsible for the engraving of trophies.
44. When jumping in the ring, the practice ring or collecting areas, ALL riders must wear protective headgear according to the standards listed below:  
All PAS 015; VG1 (BS) EN1384 2017; ASTM F1163 04a onwards; SNELL E2001; SNELL E2016; SS/NZS 3838 onwards:  
Skull caps must be of, or worn with a dark coloured plain peaked cover. Refer to your society/association rule book for further clarification. Correctly secured skull caps/riding hats that meet one of the following safety standards/specification MUST be worn by all riders between the ages of 15 to 17 inclusive. All PAS 015; VG1; (BS) EN1384 2017; ASTM F1163 O4a onwards; SNELL E2001; SNELL E2016; AS/NZS 3838 2003 onwards.

## RULES OF EXHIBITION – HORTICULTURAL AND HOME CRAFT SECTION

1. Classes are open to everyone except where otherwise stated
2. No competitor may have more than ONE entry in any class, and no exhibit may be entered in more than one class
3. All exhibits in flower and vegetable classes ( but not in floral art) must have been grown on land owned or cultivated by the competitor
4. All exhibits must be the work of the competitor, no fresh cream to be used in any cookery classes
5. In awarding prizes in the handicraft section, originality, suitability of materials, pattern and stitch are considered. For **ALL HANDICRAFT ENTRIES INCLUDING CHILDREN'S CLASSES**, exhibitors must indicate on the entry form whether this is an original design.
6. The committee may refuse any entry, subdivide any class, determine the class in which an exhibit may be judged and withhold any prize
7. The committee may appoint a member or members to inspect the gardens of competitors before the show
8. The judges may withhold or divide any prize, **THEIR DECISION IS FINAL**
